    - Gavin Vance coordinator with FOCA Lake Partner Program
  - ~ 45 members in attendance
- 2) Minutes of the 2023 AGM were approved for re-posting
- 3) Trophies

#### 4) Dysart Township –

Murray Fearrey - Mayor

(Dave Taylor reminded Murray that he had helped open the then new FIRA Hall in 1983 – 41 years ago. Pictures: https://www.firahall.ca/history)

Murray spoke about the challenges of the Township:

- workforce working from home, expenses (new plow used to be 160k, recent 300k; 2 new bridges est 1.5M\$, tender 5M\$)
- budget: initial was 13% increase, reworked as 6.5% in each of two years
- new Short Term Rental [STR] bylaw comes into force Oct 1

#### Walt McKechnie – Deputy Mayor

- Walt expanded on the STR bylaw
  - Licence fee 500\$
  - Oversight by an external company, that will manage complaints back to owner
  - Contact through a website
- Roadwork scheduled to finish late Sept
  - Re-grading of Johnson Bay
  - Additional surface gravel then resurfacing on Percy Lale
- Waste management
  - Mostly transfer stations
  - Currently trucking to Chatham, 800k/yr

- Investigating participation in Incineration with a 20 year contract
- Ted Mills asked about Green bins and Hazardous waste. Walt acknowledged the issue and would look into permanent Hazardous Waste drop off in Haliburton
- Diane Pearce asked about trailers. Walt said he would look into it.
- Anna Thanked Murray and Walt with a hand-crafted card depicting early Fort Irwin.
- 5) Guest speaker Gavin Vance FOCA's Lake Partner Program Co-ordinator
- Federation of Ontario Cottage Associations, 525 lake and road associations, headquartered in Peterborough, umbrella group for 250,000 waterfront property owners, since 1963
- Interfaces with governments on policies affecting cottage/rural property owners: capital gains, succession planning, shorelines, climate change impact, invasive species
- Lake Partner Program one of the largest citizen science programs in NA, data on Ontario inland lakes especially Windsor-Ottawa from mid 1990s. 542 lakes, 620 volunteers,
  - Annual measurement of Phosphorus, Calcium, recently salt
  - Weekly measurement of clarity (Secchi disk)
  - Analysis at MECP [Ontario Ministry of Conservation and Parks] Dorset Lab, after review, released in late Fall, published on-line end of year
  - On-line guides and report cards on web site
    - Phosphorus as a pre-cursor to algal blooms
    - Calcium as a health measure for crustaceans
    - Salt [from roads principally]
    - Clarity as a measure of upstream activity: construction, or beaver dam destruction
  - Jack Russell asked about changes over time. Mick Tilman [Lake Steward]
    mentioned weed growth. Gavin noted that would be indicative of a healthy
    shoreline habitat as they tend to filter algae.
  - Mick thanked Gavin and presented a hand-crafted card 'full' of fish.
- 6) Reports and Updates PLRA Board:
  - Membership
    - Currently 61 versus 56 same time last year. [At time of writing 65 vs 56; 153 total properties, 130 with 911addresses]
- Financial report [appended]

- Koko noted that while our revenues currently exceed expenditures, neither the insurance nor web site bills have arrived.
- Looking back at end of year reports, we have drawn on our reserve for the past two years at ~5\$/member.
- When the Board looked at this in June we recommended bringing a \$10/member fee increase to the membership at the AGM
- A motion to raise the annual membership fee to 40\$ was moved by Brian seconded by Anna and agreed unanimously.

#### 7) Any other business:

- From a discussion on attracting new members, social media, new events, a subcommittee [Diane Pearce, Alison McLean, Janine Rechsteiner and Michael Smith] was formed to consider membership and value of membership. Jack Russell joined post meeting.
- 8) Nominations, Election of directors
- Present Board was willing to continue
- No new Board members were/volunteered
